The HelgaMight

Hook: A 2X-long wet-fly hook, sizes 6 and 4.

Thread: Brown 6/0.

Eyes: Medium lead dumbbell eyes.
Tail: Olive marabou and strands of peacock Krystal Flash.

Abdomen: Black Sparkle Braid or a similar narrow, bright material, and a brown or black saddle hackle.

Thorax: Olive Crystal Chenille and an olive saddle hackle.

Head: Brown chenille.

1 Tie on the dumbbell eyes and tail.

2 Tie on a piece of narrow flash material such as black Sparkle Braid. Tie on a brown or other dark hackle by the tip.

3 Wrap the abdomen of the fly. Spiral-wrap the hackle over the abdomen. Tie off and clip the excess material.

4 Tie on a piece of olive Crystal Chenille and an olive hackle. Wrap the Crystal Chenille and hackle up the hook to form the thorax.

5 Tie on and wrap a piece of brown chenille around the dumbbell eyes. Tie off and clip the chenille. Make a neat thread head.

the body. I've tied many HelgaMight variations, but there are three important features that should not vary. First, the HelgaMight must have a thick thorax. Second, tie the fly with a dark abdomen, an olive thorax, and a brown head. And third, a weight-forward design accentuates the pattern's swimming action. I usually connect the fly to my tippet with a loop knot to enhance this swimming motion.

As the season progresses into summer, there is a growing abundance of food, and the fish are not as ravenous as they were closer to ice-out. This is when dragonflies and other large nymphs cease being important prey for many fish, and the allure of the HelgaMight abates. Happily, this period coincides with fish feeding on the surface, and I change flies and tactics. But when the fish are feeding on large nymphs, the HelgaMight is a perfect go-to fly.

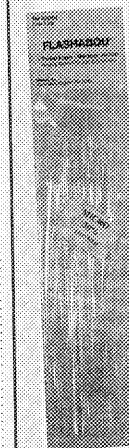

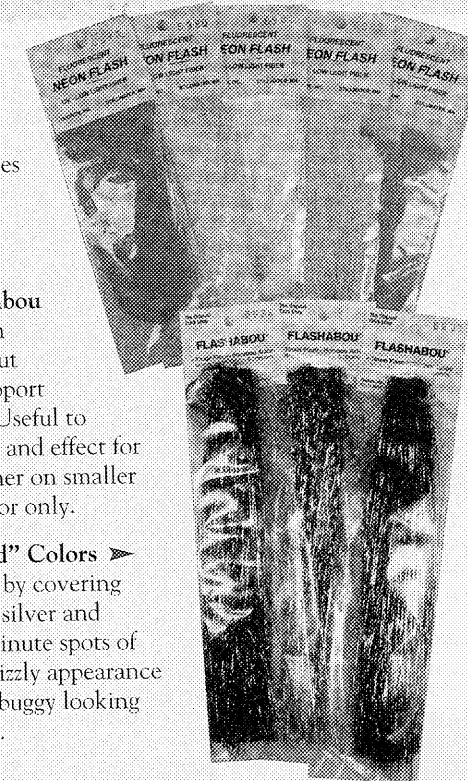


Micro Pearl Flashabou
